Explosion Rocks Port

EARLIER TODAY at around 4am an explosion rang through southern London as a warehouse on the port property exploded and showered an area of approx. 2 miles with burning and hot clay debris. In a miraculous

series of coincidents, no one got hurt by the white-hot shrapnel.

As of now investigations are ongoing and the police declines any comment on the probable cause.

Speculations run rampant, as typical right-wing mouthpieces try to paint this as another act of terrorism, even though there is no single point of evidence leading to such conclusions.

The warehouse in question was luckily empty at the time of the explosion, contrary to first reports. It was feared that a substantial part of the recently excavated Greek clay-

warriors was destroyed, but they have been moved away prior to midnight, to their proper storage in the basement of the British Museum. The clay that rained the city all belonged to the residue that was scheduled to be transported away early in the morning today.

Queen To Honour Veterans

ON SATURDAY, THE birthday of Major Anders Lassen, Danish recipient of the Victoria Cross and honorary member of the Special Boat Service, Our Majesty will hold a small, festive ceremony with the surviving holders of the Victory Cross who were awarded it during actions in the Second World War.

Press and public will be barred from attendance as it is meant as something along the lines of a „family event“.

As such security will not be provided by neither Scotland Yard nor the regular Police,

but by the Armed Forces itself.

Official spokespersons have commented that the Queen is very much looking forward to this event, as this gives her the chance to catch up with people she hasn't seen for up to two decades now.

Preceding it all was a Commonwealth-wide search effort to locate each and every one VC bearer still alive.

The Veteran's Aid Organization as well as local officials have been a „tremendous help“ and

received personal and warm thanks by the Queen herself.

In a surprising move, Tories and Labour have postponed a Parliament debate on the

recent scandal involving corruption in the General's Corps of the Army, as to honour the occasion and the people involved.
